Warman City Council Responds to Proposed Joint-Use High School Location in RM of Corman Park

Warman, SK — In response to community and media interest and questions regarding the proposed new joint-use high school intended to serve the Warman area, Warman City Council wishes to clarify its position and its ongoing concerns surrounding the proposed location on Township Road 384 in the RM of Corman Park, between Martensville and Warman.

Council fully supports the need for additional school infrastructure to meet the needs of our growing community, as this is a vital concern to our residents.

One of Council's primary concerns is the financial impact of servicing a remote location. Warman City Council believes that locating the new high school within Warman itself would be a more responsible and cost-effective alternative for Warman taxpayers.

Costs of acquiring land, of water and wastewater services, of transportation upgrades, and of power and gas servicing would come at a significant and unnecessary expense....much higher than what the costs could be by working with existing development partners within Warman.

Council is also considering the long-term implications for student transportation. Busing students outside of Warman to the proposed rural location raises several concerns related to issues such as accessibility, safety and daily commute times for families.

The priority of Warman City Council is to make decisions that are in the best interest of Warman residents—not just for today, but for the future. Locating the new school within city limits ensures better integration with the community, safer and shorter transportation for students, and greater alignment with existing municipal infrastructure at a more efficient cost.

Council will be exploring engagement opportunities for residents and stakeholders. Hearing as many perspectives as possible is vital in ensuring that the decisions made by Council reflect the needs and priorities of the Warman community.
